Mayor's Message

River Heights has four projects going on recently and in the near future.

- 1. Repair and resurfacing of 650 South Street adjacent to 600 East. The purpose of this project was to re-design the street so water will no longer pool at the entrance and to redo the road surface.
- 2. Reinstallation of the street, curb, gutter and sidewalk on 600 South from River Heights Blvd. to 400 South. This project will begin about September 18 and will be completed on or before December 16, 2015. The project will smooth the extremely bumpy street, contain the run-off water during storms, and provide more sidewalk for safer pedestrian traffic.
- 3. Installation of a 8 inch water main from the fire hydrant on 700 South at approximately 150 East to the property for the new Nyman Funeral Home to be constructed at 100 East from 750 South to 800 South. This project will provide looping of our water system and adequate volume for fire protection.
- 4. Construction of homes from 600 South to Orchard Drive and 850 East to 1000 East. This is an on-going project and we encourage you to drive carefully around it.
